You've heard people say that a crisis brings out the best and the worst in people. We're in a crisis right now, and many people are just waking up to the fact. It didn't really begin to sink in until our state, Michigan, began generating some of the worst statistics of coronavirus cases and deaths. Before this is over we may all either know, or be related to, someone who had the virus. The closer this scourge gets to us the more of a crisis it becomes.

It's a major crossroad in our lives. What is a person to do in the midst of the crisis? Two very interesting and divergent pathways have begun to appear in society. One pathway is described by people buying more than normal amounts of alcohol and guns. Of course, many reasons may explain the gun sales, and one of those is a desire to protect oneself against criminals being released from prison in certain parts of our country. In addition to these, counselors and lawyers report a big uptick in household strife. This is leading to broken relationships and an increase in people seeking a divorce. One can only hope that a good number of Bibles are being purchased by people who fully intend to read them. If the end result of this pandemic is that people begin to read God's Word, well that's the epitome of bringing good out of the bad.

Now, Holy Week just happens to occur at the same time as the worst week yet of the pandemic. Coincidence? Not likely. The message of Holy Week is a message that's intended to put an end to strife. It's a message of ultimate peace, peace with God. It's a message that heals the most important relationship in all of our lives, our relationship with God.

Jesus' horrible death on a cross, and his resurrection was for each one of us. We must accept the fact that Jesus' death was a payment for the sins we've committed. The cross is our invitation to come back to God. We have sinned in many ways, and we need a Savior. And the only reasonable thing to do is to ask God to forgive our sins. Then we must turn around and start living for Jesus, by reading his Word and doing what we learn. We must be willing to let God cleans our hearts and minds, and change us, and He will do it. He will give us a new heart that loves God and loves people; an unselfish heart. He will give us His Holy Spirit who leads us and guides us, and so much more.

Why not allow the crisis of the Cross to defeat the crisis of the virus. Since we're all spending more time at home, let's indulge in God's word. We'll be surprised at the peace it brings into our lives and relationships.


